- 1. Students 25 or older are exempted from Physical Education activity requirement.
- 2. All students must satisfy the English Proficiency Requirement.
- 3. The Ohio Transfer Module completed at SCC will automatically meet the requirements of the Ohio Transfer Module at CSU, once the student is accepted.
- 4. Piano Majors must take FOUR credits of Accompanying Class or Secondary Applied instead of Piano Class.
- 5. Admissions to the Music Performance degree program require students to audition prior to enrollment.
- 6. A grade of "C" or better is required for music courses; "B" or better in principal applied courses.
